We had a late start as the CSSL AGM was delayed due to the

For 2021, CSSL formulated a comprehensive annual program under the pillars of **Engage, Influence, Contribute and Voice**.

Our flagship event National Information Technology Conference (NITC) was conducted successfully in October 2021 defying the pandemic. A new feature CSSL CEO Conclave was added to the National Information Technology Conference (NITC).

Amidst the pandemic and countrywide lockdowns, CSSL



had a busy year and several new initiatives.

CSSL Policy Advocacy Committee was formed with past presidents and eminent members of CSSL. CSSL Digital Policy Advocacy Committee aims to elevate CSSL to be an influencer in Digital Policy Formation in Sri Lanka and conducted 4 strategic policy dialogues in 2021.

A significant achievement in 2021 is the formation of the first CSSL Undergraduate Chapter at Sir General John Kotelawala Defense University followed by University of Jaffna. It is my privilege to welcome new CSSL GenZ Chapters to the CSSL family.

In 2021 CSSL initiated a journey on establishing Continuous Professional Development (CPD) framework for the apex professional body for ICT professionals in the country and working towards achieving IFIP's IP3 Accreditation.

CSSL also conducted 3 Tech Talks, 3 GenZ Forums, two CSSL Fellows Forum, a Members' Forum and 23 Executive Council meetings since 26th January 2021 AGM. 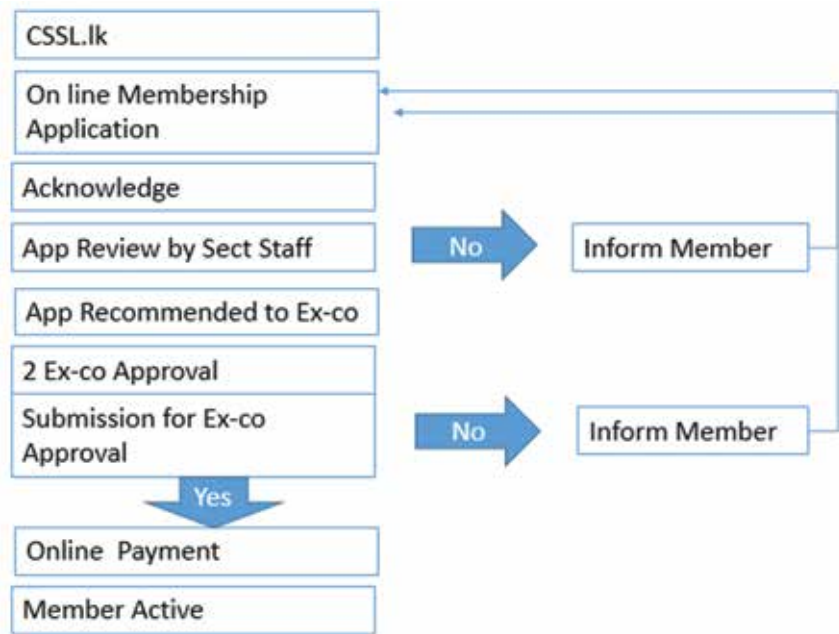

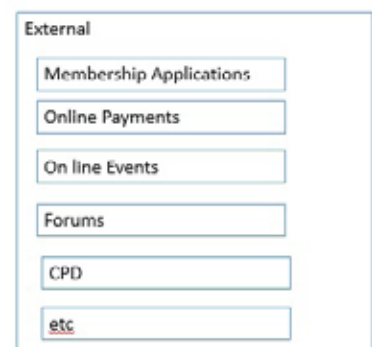
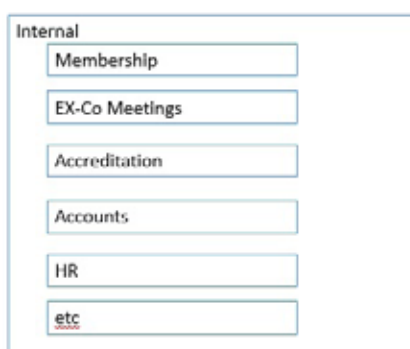

Continued Professional Development Policy for CSSL

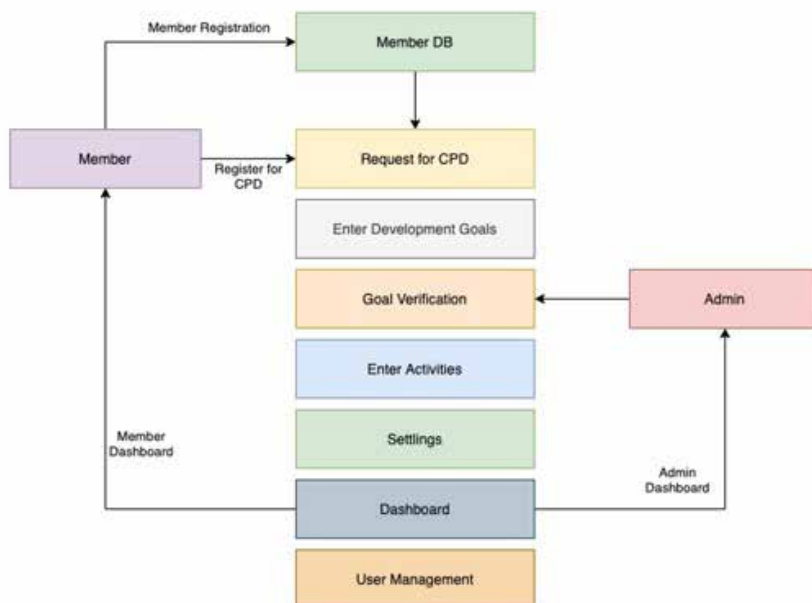

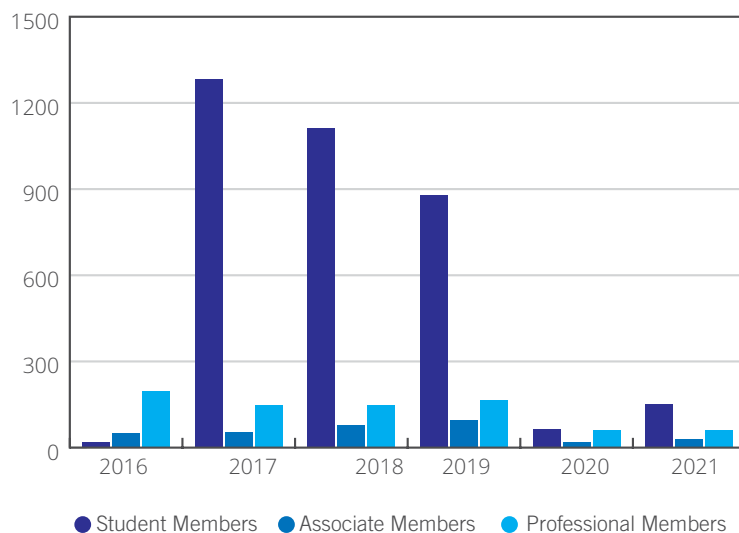

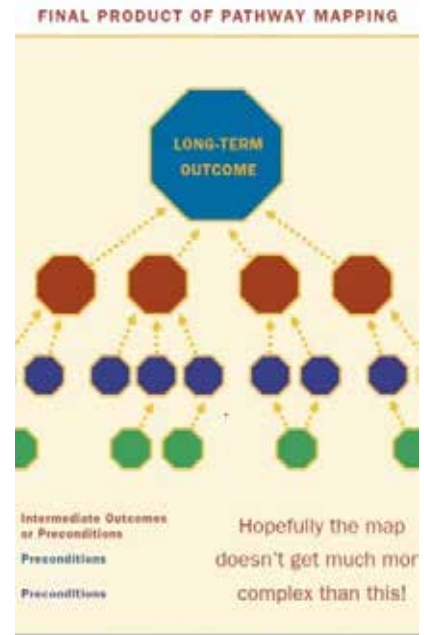

The objective of the member's forum were

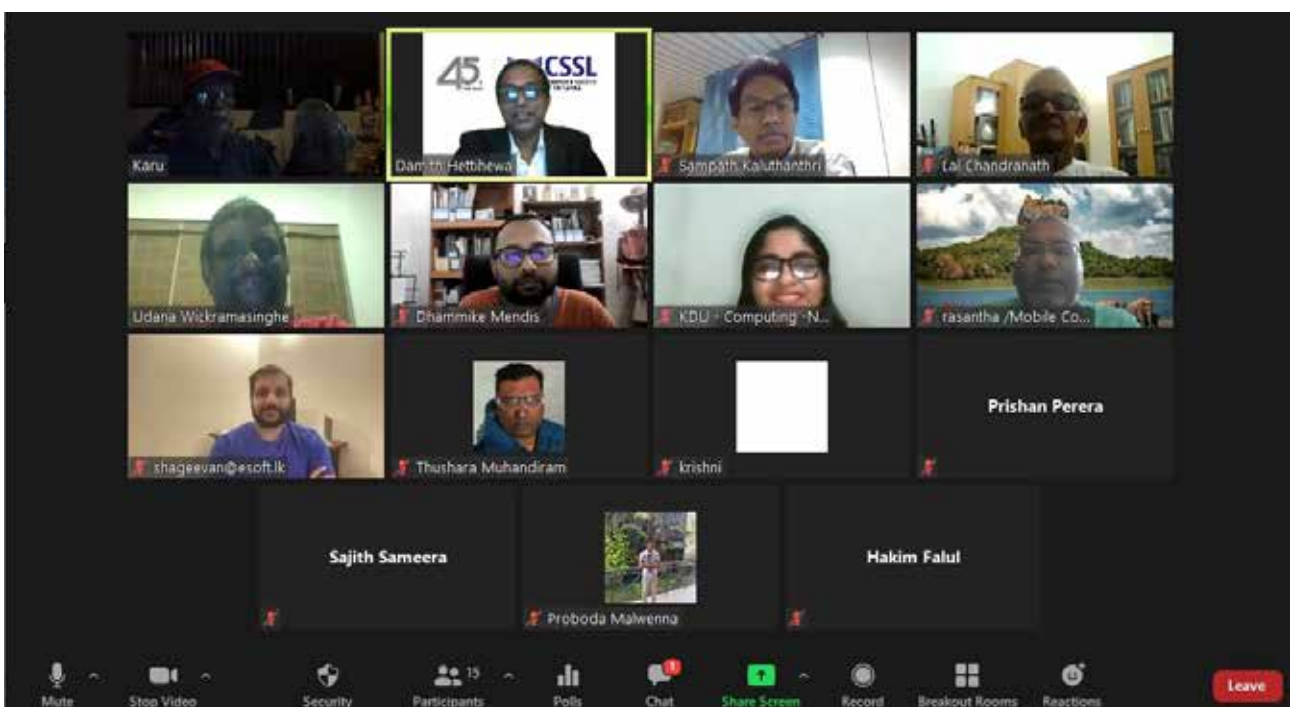
- Update the membership of the progress made for the year based on the plan presented by President at the AGM

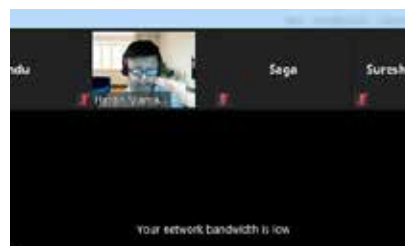

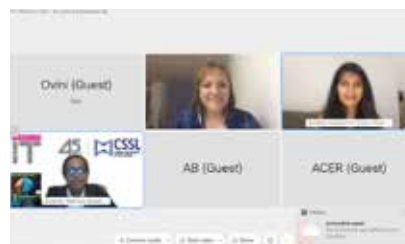

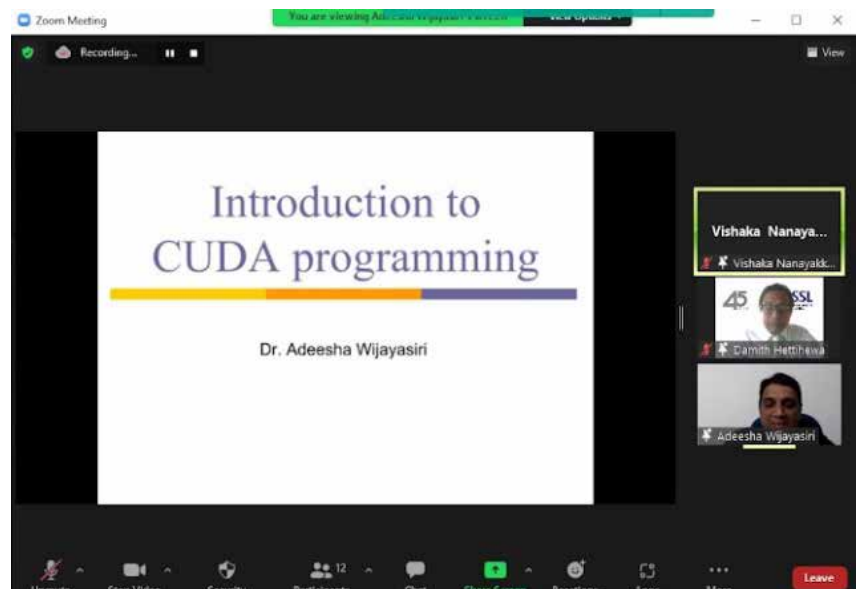

Funding for AI and other frontier technology research in Sri Lanka

Background

All industrial revolutions created wealthy nations (ie: I1.0: Europe, I2.0 : Americas, I3.0: Japan, Korea). The Computer Society of Sri Lanka (CSSL) is advocating Sri Lanka to leverage Industry 4.0 to become a wealthy nation through digital acceleration. LK Domain Registry has come forward to partner with CSSL in this endeavor.

LK Domain will collaborate with CSSL to foster and promote development of products and services based on frontier technologies (including AI) in Sri Lanka, by granting funds for selected project proposals on frontier technologies artificial intelligence and machine learning to solve real-world problems creating globally competitive digital products and solutions from Sri Lankan innovators. This may be branded under the Prof. V.K. Samaranayake grants programme.

Governance and Administration of the FT Funding Program

The program will be branded as a project of the LK Domain Registry under the Prof. V. K. Samaranayake grants programme. It will be carried out jointly with the CSSL. Computer Society of Sri Lanka (CSSL) will administer the initiative, and will be identified as a co-organiser.

Framework for Collaboration

CSSL and LK Domain will enter in to an agreement for the



governance and administration of the programme. The agreement will outline the terms of collaboration by parties. The agreement will refer to this terms of reference document.

Mechanism of Administrating AI and Frontier Technologies research program

CSSL will appoint a grants governance committee (GGC) comprising of reputable ICT practitioners, social innovators, academia and ex-officio members of CSSL and LK Domain Registry. GGC will evaluate the research proposals for funding and make its recommendations.

The LK Domain Registry Board may approve each Frontier Technology grant, based on the recommendation of the grants governance committee.

All eligible research proposals considered for grants should be in line with the objectives of the funding program outlined in Grant Program Objectives.

CSSL will call Expression of interest for Research Grants through mass and social media, letters and e-mail from time to time.

Research grant request proposals will be evaluated by the Grant Governance Committee (GGC) and make recommendation to the LK

Domain Registry for grant disbursement

Grant Evaluation and Disbursement Criteria

Grants will be made available for funding of product oriented PhD research of AI and Frontier Digital technologies which has the potential to produce an outcome as a product or service specify

Early-stage ideas with will be considered, however ideas or ideas developed to a prototype stage would be given preference and feasible plan for implementation that will benefit society. Both the system and its proponents should show clear evidence of commercial viability. The funding will typically be for advancing a research proof-of-concept (POC) to a pilot product/service which will attract Angel/VC investors.

Typically, applicants should show not only a solid academic research background, but also expertise in product commercialisation. As such many applications may be made jointly by a university research group and a company.

Grants based on above criteria will be evaluated and recommended by GGC.

Detailed Grant Evaluation Criteria will be formulated by the first GGC and will be ratified by CSSL Ex-co and LK Domain Board of directors

Grant Application, Disbursement, Monitoring criteria and the KPI based grant disbursement method should be well defined in order to ensure the return of investment (ROI) of the grant.

Grant Evaluation Criteria will be reviewed from time to time by the GGC.

Grant Period

Grant period is one year extendable by GGC based on progress of the work.

Proposal for more than one year funding will be entertained but grant extensions will be on annual basis.

Grant Amounts

The total Annual Grant amount and the maximum for a specific project and will be decided by LK Domain board and will inform CSSL annually.

After the recent news item on cyber-attacks on the Presidential Secretariat and several other government websites, it has come to light that the so-called Information Technology Society of Sri Lanka (ITSSL) is a non-entity. It seems to be a one-man operation which is seeking public attention through frequent press releases under a fictitious association. Rajiv Yasiru Kuruvilage, the person claimed to be the Chairman of a fictitious association has been arrested.

"It is also learnt that the arrested person has no ICT related qualification and he has not done any ICT related employment in any reputable institution," a release from The Computer Society of Sri Lanka (CSSL) President Damith Hettihewa (pictured) said.

"ITSSL has been issuing frequent press releases on IT industry matters claiming to be an industry association. We observe that ITSSL does not give a proper physical address, office contact details or published membership, and a list of officials."

ITSSL earlier said in a press release that many government websites including that of the Presidential Secretariat, Foreign Ministry and several others were subjected to cyber-attacks. Sri Lanka Computer Emergency Readiness Team (SLCERT) earlier denied such attacks and stated that the media statements were misleading.

Inaugural CEO Conclave @ NITC

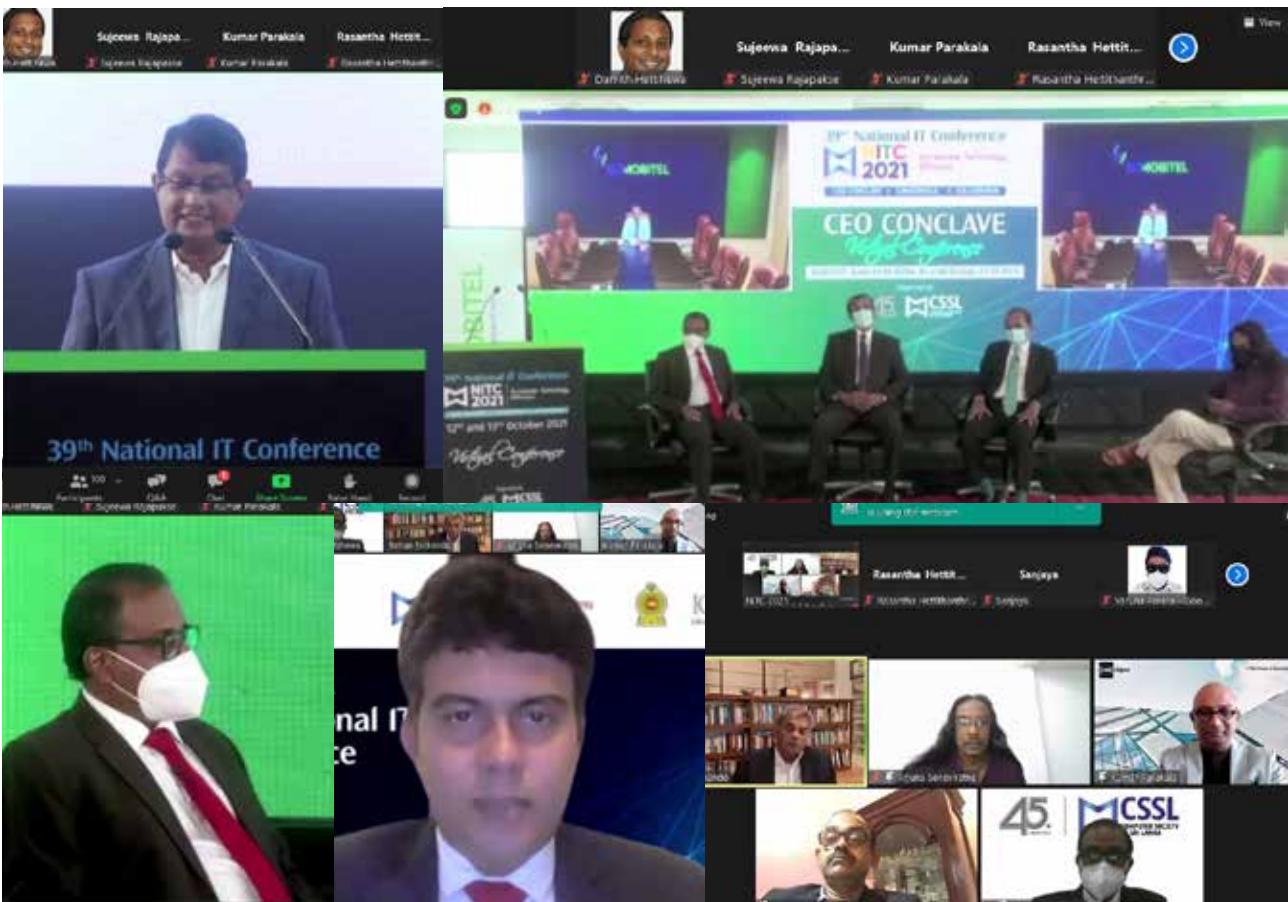
